364,036 Beneficiaries "not in the database" clarified during the COA Exit Conference (Sept., 2014)

Breakdown:

- 107,373 Regular CCT households
 - These are found both in the Pantawid Pamilya and National Household Targeting Office (NHTO) databases.
 (*COA could not locate them because of their limited viewing access to the NHTO database)
- 256,663 Modified CCT household
 - By design, MCCT households are those not enumerated by the NHTO, but are considered as poor and part of the vulnerable sector. MCCT beneficiaries information are stored in a separate database and is open for COA's viewing

Payment of ₱1.081 B to 364,036 HHs legitimate

- DSWD ensures cash grants are paid only to registered eligible household beneficiaries whose identities have been properly validated
- Payment of cash grants to MCCT beneficiaries are justified based on DSWD's mandate to provide social protection and assistance to the poor, marginalized, and vulnerable

Almost all 21,117 "non-poor" beneficiaries verified as Poor

 21,089 of these have been verified as poor during the enumeration of households in 2009

28 households are still undergoing further validation

4,032 Double Household Entries undergoing validation

- Based on partial validation results from 15 (out of 17) regional offices:
 - 1,752 were verified as unique households and were retained in the program
 - 609 verified as duplicates and were delisted

1,636 remaining entries undergoing validation
